

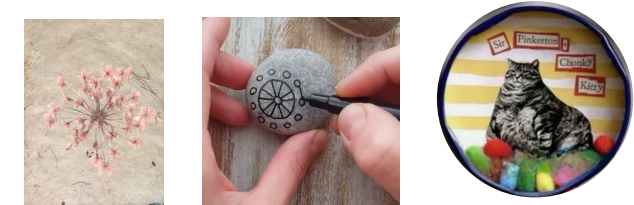

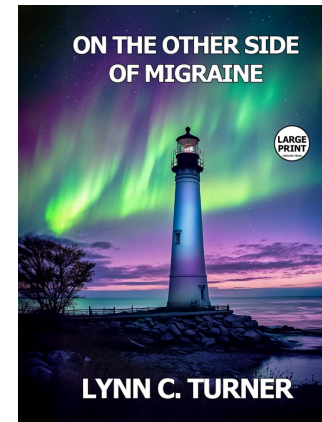

Author Book Talks



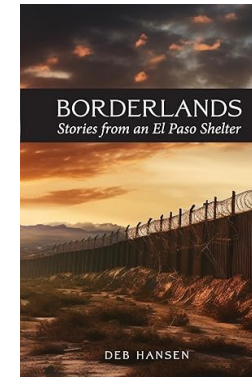
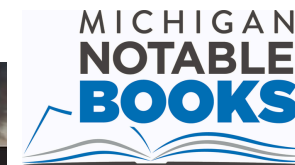
Lynn Turner

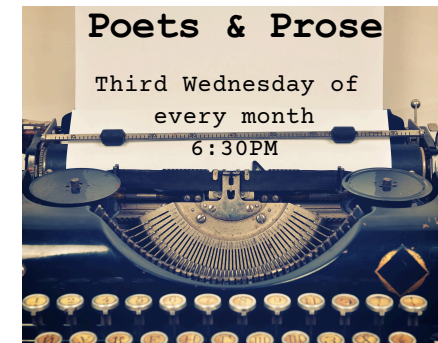
