Tuesday, June. 23rd, 7:00 PM



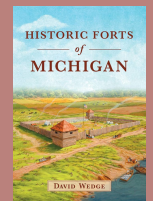

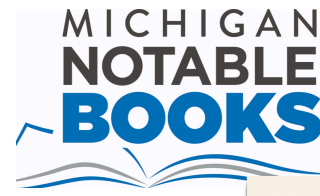

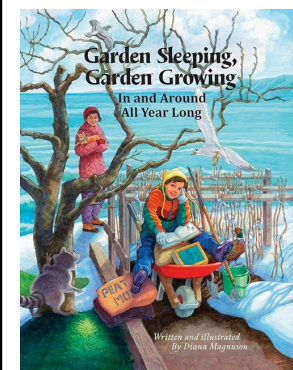
